2. Public Comment

There were no comments.

3. Regular Calendar

3.1 Station 45 Emergency Repair

The wastewater pipes under Station-45 are failing. Raw sewage has begun (slowly) leaking and will contaminate the exercise room, turnout and CERT storage area, and/or archive file room. Wastewater is presently backing up into other portions of the drainage system.

Staff does not feel there is time to formally bid the project and/or wait until the next regular Board meeting on January 6, 2016 for approval. Therefore, staff has called a special meeting with the purpose of authorizing staff to execute a contract to repair the wastewater pipes without completing the formal bid process.

To date, staff has received only one estimate, with several other plumbing companies declining the work. Another estimate is pending and should be available by the Special Meeting. The projected cost is not to exceed \$40,000. Sufficient appropriations are available in the Capital Projects Fund.

Motion by Director Famulener and seconded by Director Barber, the Board declared that an emergency situation exists and delegated authority to Fire Chief Healy to mitigate the emergency. Said motion carried a unanimous 5-0 roll-call vote (Ayes: Anderson, Barber, Evans, Famulener and Weil).

The Board asked staff to research the following:

- The Board acting with less than a quorum in the event of a health and safety emergency
- Giving the Fire Chief the authority to spend up to \$50K on emergency situations
- Having the Board Chair, Finance Chair and Fire Chief declare emergency situations and report to the Board subsequently
- Budget for emergency situations so that staff can act within the budget authorization

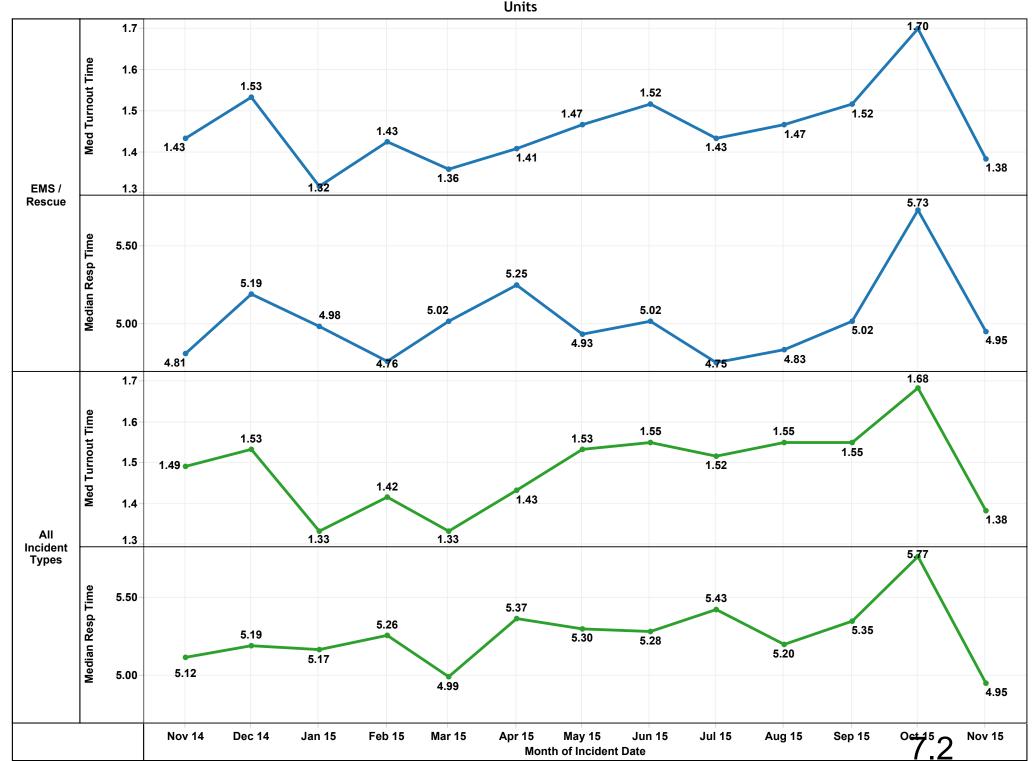

SUBJECT: Item 8.1 – Adoption of Resolution No. 16-01 Declaration of Official Intent

BACKGROUND

On November 18, 2015, the Board authorized the issuance of a direct placement lease agreement in the amount of \$4,000,000 for a 20-year term to finance the Station-43 rebuild. The debt issuance is planned to occur in May 2016. Currently the District is incurring costs related to the Station-43 rebuild for preliminary costs such as architectural, engineering, permits and similar expenditures.

In order to use debt proceeds to pay for project costs incurred prior to the debt issuance, it is necessary to adopt a resolution declaring the District's official intent to reimburse the District from the debt proceeds for the preliminary expenditures. The resolution states the principal amount of the obligations to be issued will not exceed \$5M. The projected project cost is \$4M. However, this amount is still being finalized. The District will also incur costs of issuance for the debt. The resolution is written to provide a cushion for the amount of debt issuance if the project costs exceed \$4M.

RESOLUTION NO. 16-01

RESOLUTION OF MORAGA-ORINDA FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT DECLARATION OF OFFICIAL INTENT

WHEREAS, the Moraga-Orinda Fire Protection District (the "District") has determined that there exists a need for the construction, renovation and equipping of Station 43 in Orinda, California (the "Project") to provide fire protection services to the population within its jurisdiction.

WHEREAS, the District expects to issue bonds, notes or other debt obligations (the "Obligations") to provide funds to pay various types of expenditures incurred in connection with the Project.

WHEREAS, (a) more than sixty days preceding the date of this Resolution (the "Official Intent Date") and before the issuance of the Obligations, the District has or may have initially used funds not derived from the proceeds of the Obligations to pay certain preliminary expenditures for architectural, engineering, surveying, soil testing, costs of issuing the Obligations or similar purposes, (b) within the sixty days preceding the Official Intent Date and before the issuance of the Obligations, the District has or may have initially used funds not derived from the proceeds of the Obligations to pay certain acquisition, planning, design, legal or other costs and expenses incurred by the District in connection with the Project, and (c) the District expects initially to use funds not derived from proceeds of the Obligations to pay on or after the Official Intent Date and before the issuance of the Obligations additional acquisition, planning, design, legal and other costs and expenses incurred by the District in connection with the Project (collectively, the "Advanced Funds").

WHEREAS, the District reasonably anticipates that the Advanced Funds will be available to pay expenditures incurred in connection with the Project only for a temporary period and does not reasonably expect to have any funds (other than the proceeds of the Obligations) allocated on a long-term basis, reserved, or otherwise available pursuant to its budgetary or financial policies to pay the expenditures initially to be paid with the Advanced Funds.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Treasury Department regulations do not allow the proceeds of a tax-exempt borrowing to be spent on working capital.

WHEREAS, the District may pay certain capital expenditures in connection with the Project prior to its receipt of proceeds of the Obligations for such expenditures and such expenditures are not expected to exceed the Maximum Principal Amount (as defined below).

WHEREAS, the District hereby declares its official intent to be reimbursed for any capital expenditures incurred in connection with the Project from the proceeds of the Obligations.

Attachment A

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Directors of the District:

SECTION 1. <u>Expression of Intent</u>. The District reasonably expects to use the proceeds of the Obligations to be issued by it to reimburse itself for some or all of the expenditures described below made with the Advanced Funds.

SECTION 2. Expenditures to be Reimbursed. All of the expenditures initially paid or to be paid with the Advanced Funds and then to be reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations have been or will be for (i) costs of a type properly chargeable to the capital account of the Project under general income tax principles, (ii) non-recurring working capital expenditures (that are not customarily payable from current revenues), or (iii) costs of issuing the Obligations. No proceeds of the Obligations will be used to reimburse any expenditures originally paid more than sixty days prior to the Official Intent Date except those expenditures constituting "preliminary expenditures." For purposes of this Resolution, "preliminary expenditures" means expenditures for architectural, engineering, surveying, soil testing, costs of issuing the Obligations, or similar purposes.

SECTION 3. <u>Maximum Amount of Debt</u>. The District intends that the principal amount of the Obligations to be issued by it to provide financing for the Project will not exceed \$5,000,000 (the "Maximum Principal Amount").

SECTION 4. <u>Declaration of Official Intent</u>. This Resolution constitutes a declaration of the official intent of the District, within the contemplation of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations promulgated by the United States Department of the Treasury.

SECTION 5. <u>Effectiveness of Resolution</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval.

FIRE PREVENTION

Fire Prevention Software Update

We are still scheduled to go live on December 31 this year. Staff has been working extensively with the vendor to finalize the custom program that will greatly improve efficiency and accountability for permitting, plan review, conditions of approval information, and invoicing.

Fee Impact Study

The final draft with the recommendations should be ready by the end of the month. Staff will evaluate the next steps to implement a new policy for developer impact fees.

Valley Fire Tour

The Fire Marshal, along with other fire officials, Cal Fire representatives, and members representing Fire Safe Councils from the Bay Area, traveled to Lake County for a tour of the area burned in the Valley Fire this last fall. The fire burned 76,067 acres, destroyed 1958 structures, with 4 fatalities and 4 serious firefighter injuries. Lessons learned included the need for a fire emergency plan, early evacuation, the importance of vegetation clearance, protection of ember intrusion into homes, and adequate clearance of vegetation over roadways for incoming fire equipment.

DISTRICT PROJECTS

1. Via Moraga (Old Bowling Alley site)

The 17 single family home project on the old bowling site in Moraga is grading for roads and will soon build a model home.

2. Camino Ricardo Subdivision

The 26-lot subdivision is working on finishing grading, installing retaining walls, and will soon be constructing 3 models homes towards the front of the project.

3. Rancho Laguna II Subdivision

The 26-lot subdivision is planned along Rheem Blvd is currently grading and will be constructing 2 model homes. All of the initial grading is completed for the roads going back to the 2 courts that are in the rear of the project.

4. Palos Colorados

The final map for the 124-lot subdivision in Moraga near Sky Hy Ranch has been approved. Grading is expected to commence in the spring.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

- 1. On Sunday, November 1, Staff assisted volunteers from the Lamorinda Radio Interest Group (K6ORI) with maintenance and repairs at the Town of Moraga's Public Works Radio site. The group spent about three (3) hours at the site replacing worn antenna cables, grounding the equipment, and adjusting hardware.
- 2. On Saturday, November 7, staff hosted the MOFD Communications-Support Unit meeting at Station-45. Will Pigeon, the interim Contra Costa Regional Communications Center Manager was our guest. The group discussed ways to become more involved in regional communications-support functions. Other topics included: equipment updates, after action reviews for Operation Delta Guard, the Rough Fire, and the Great ShakeOut.
- 3. On Monday evening, November 9, Lamorinda CERT held its monthly meeting at the Orinda Community Center. 23 CERT members attended the perishable skills refresher session on basic triage and head-to-toe assessments.
- 4. On November 11, staff met with St. Mary's College's Director of Public Safety to finalize plans for their 2015 campus evacuation exercise. The drill will be held on December 17th and include activation the College's Emergency Operations Center, and coordinating with Moraga PD and MOFD during a simulated wildfire-caused evacuation.
- On November 12, Staff attended the Contra Costa County Cities Citizen Corps Councils Committee (C8) meeting. The group brings together representatives from the cities and CERT teams to discuss common issues and coordination between CERT and county agencies.
- 6. On November 12, staff assisted the City of Orinda with programming and organizing their 20-unit community radio cache. The radios will allow the city to distribute radios for local events and emergencies. The Orinda cache is compatible with the equipment that is already in service in Lafayette, Moraga, Lamorinda elementary schools, and MOFD.
- 7. On Friday, November 13th, staff met a representative from the El Toyonal neighborhood to discuss organizing neighborhood emergency preparedness. The area is interested in becoming better organized for emergencies and deciding if they want to participate in the Ready Lamorinda Program.
- 8. On November 18, staff attended the Lamorinda Radio Interest Group (K6ORI) meeting in the Sarge Little-Hale room in Orinda. The group continues to develop amateur radio resources that could be used by the Lamorinda cities during a disaster. 12 new HAM radio operators recently completed training and received their Amateur Radio Technician licenses.

- 9. On Wednesday evening, November 18, staff made a presentation to about 15 members of the Orinda Highlands Home Owners Association. The 30-minute talk covered Fire Prevention and Emergency Preparedness. The group was very receptive and is continuing to work to organize their neighborhood to be better prepared for emergencies.
- 10. On November 19, staff met with Jill Ray (staff from Supervisor Candace Andersen's office), Canyon Steinzig (Canyon Homeowners Association), and two Geographic Information Systems specialists regarding an update to the emergency response maps for the Community of Canyon. Staff will continue to work with the community and the county to insure that MOFD has the best possible mapping for Canyon.
- 11. On November 20, staff assisted five K6ORI volunteers with setting up the Emergency Operations Center communications for the Town of Moraga's Emergency Operations Center. The crew erected several antennas and ran antenna cables into the building. The project should be completed early in 2016.
- 12. On November 24, staff attended a tour of the Valley Fire with members of the Diablo FireSafe Council, the Santa Clara County FireSafe Council, and Cal Fire.
- 13. On November 30, staff attended the Lamorinda CERT Steering Committee and Lamorinda CERT Foundation meetings. The steering committee discussed logistics for January's Basic CERT training class. Currently there are over 50 students signed-up to attend the training that will be held at the Lafayette Community Center. The successful recruiting has been attributed to two recent articles in local papers and CERT's new presence on Lamorinda's Nextdoor (social media) site.
